A PROUD HISTORY: THE DULA STORY

The origins of Dongguk University Los Angeles date back to 1976, when Dr. Chang-Ki Kim began teaching the fundamentals of acupuncture and Oriental Medicine at his Sei Shin Acupuncture Clinic. Encouraged by his patients, who yearned to learn more about this ancient and proven healing art. Dr. Kim took the initial steps toward his goal of combining research and educational pursuits, along with providing chari-table health services to the surrounding community. Dr. Kim's goal was realized in 1979 with the founding of Royal University of America, which began with just three faculty and eleven students.

Eighteen years later Dongguk (which translates to "East Country")
University, one of South Korea's oldest and most prestigious institutions of higher learning, widely esteemed for its outstanding College of Oriental Medicine, added Royal University of America to its fold, renaming it Dongguk Royal University. In 2009, Dongguk Royal University was rededicated as Dongguk University Los Angeles during its anniversary celebration. During the rededication ceremony, a mutual exchange agreement was signed with Dongguk University Korea detailing the collaborative benefits for each University. Collectively, these two institutions, on either side of the Pacific, have been providing outstanding education to students throughout the world.

THE MASTER OF SCIENCE IN ORIENTAL MEDICINE (MSOM) DEGREE

The DULA MSOM program is designed to provide you with an outstanding, well-rounded, integrated medical curriculum in a student-oriented environment.

DULA offers its Master's degree in three languages: English, Chinese, and Korean. By offering a theme-based education that is both broad and deep, by placing students in a variety of clinical settings, and by encouraging them to develop a holistic approach to patient care, we train resourceful practitioners, who serve society compassionately, while keeping pace with an ever-changing professional world. Upon the successful completion of the program, students are eligible to sit for the licensing examination given by the California Acupuncture Board, as well as the examination given by the National Certification Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine (NCCAOM).

The MSOM degree requires a total of 3,090 training hours, of which 2,130 (or 213 units) are comprised of didactic training, with the balance (960 hours) devoted to clinical internship, at our own oncampus clinic or off-campus sites. Course work includes studies in Oriental medical theory, acupuncture, herbology and herbal formulas, Western medicine and science, Tui-na (traditional Chinese massage therapy), and practice management and ethical practices, in addition to the clinical internship. More specifically, DULA's academic program consists of the following:

Basic Sciences and Western Medicine	740 hours
Oriental Medicine and Acupuncture	760 hours
Herbal Medicine	450 hours
Case Management	90 hours
Professional Development	30 hours
Electives	60 hours
Clinical Internship	960 hours

After completing 60 quarter units of specific didactic course requirements, students may register for the Clinic Level I: Observation and Herbal Practicum. Students must also have a Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and First Aid certificate among other requirements before registering for the clinic. The clinical training at the DULA Oriental Medicine Center (OMC) consists of 960 hours which are divided into three levels of clinical internship. Interns are required to demonstrate diagnostic and treatment skills on a minimum of 350 patients during the course of Level II & III internships.

THE DOCTOR OF ACUPUNCTURE AND ORIENTAL MEDICINE (DAOM) DEGREE PROGRAM

The DULA DAOM is a two-year program divided into eight quarters. Each quarter corresponds to Master's Program quarter schedule. The program totals 1290 hours; of which 640 hours will be didactic and 650 hours will be clinical. Of the 640 didactic hours of coursework, 320 hours are devoted to the core curriculum and 320 hours focusing on the integrative pain management specialty.

The curriculum includes materials necessary to advance knowledge and applications of clinical practice and for the development of leaders in the field. The intention of DULA's doctoral program is to offer an integrated method to the study of a variety of conditions treated by Oriental Medicine. This methodology is intended to reflect actual clinical experiences.

Biomedical and TCM experts lecture in specialty training courses providing DAOM Students with advanced knowledge and skills in assessment and disease etiology. DAOM students are expected to gain consultation and collaboration skills and to build professional relationships with physicians and other healthcare professionals.

Students progress through the program in a modular cycle of course work. Course descriptions and prerequisites are listed in the catalog. Progression in the doctoral program distributes academic and clinical coursework uniformly over two years. The program allocates adequate time to complete the requirements of the program, affirming the purpose and educational objectives of the program.

Specialty Training - The program involves rigorous didactics in specialization fields. DAOM Students will specialize in Integrative Pain Management. Course construction is designed to optimize learning specific to the specialty and concentrate on depth of experience. DAOM Students will demonstrate a standard of competency in their area of specialization at each evaluation period.

The background and professional experiences of our doctoral students are rich and diverse. Our doctoral students come from the United States and the Asia, with diverse medical background. Some of our students come to DULA with prior medical trainings in Chinese and Western medicine from China. Some of our students come with nearly 30 years of experience in practicing acupuncture and Oriental Medicine, and some of them are already professionals in the field of medical industry and research.

DAOM has been granted Pre-Accreditation status by the Accreditation Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine (ACAOM) and is in the process of seeking accreditation for this program.

APPLYING TO DULA

MASTERS OF SCIENCE IN ORIENTAL MEDICINE (MSOM)

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

A Bachelor's degree is preferred for all applications of the Masters of Science in Oriental Medicine program at Dongguk University Los Angeles. A background in western medicine is not required, nor is a graduate school entrance exam. Applicants who have not earned a bachelor's degree must have completed a minimum of an Associate's degree, or 60 semester units (90 quarter units) of the baccalaureate level education from a regionally accredited, degree-granting college or university. A cumulative GPA of 2.25 or higher is required to apply. Only those who demonstrates a likelihood of success in the field of oriental medicine will be accepted for admission within the accommodation capacity.

- * Late fee \$20 will be added for late applications
- 3. One passport-sized photo in white, black or light blue background taken within 3 months

 - Your interest in and/or philosophical view of Oriental Medicine
 - What are your strength and skills that would make you a good healthcare practitioner?

- 7. Copy of diploma(s) from previous colleges and/or universities
- 8. Sealed official transcripts from previous colleges and/or universities

LANGAUGE REQUIREMENTS

The language requirement for English program is satisfied by;

60 semester units or 90 quarter units of baccalaureate level education taught in English at an institution accredited by an agency recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education, or from an equivalent English language institution in another country



 A minimum score of 61 (speaking 26 and listening 22) on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) Internet-Based Test (IBT) or a level 6 on the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) Exam

The language requirement for Chinese/Korean program is satisfied by;

• A minimum score of 45 (speaking 18 and listening 15) on the TOEFL/IBT. For non-native English speakers wishing to enroll in English program, a minimum score of 61 (speaking score 26 and listening 22) on the TOEFL/IBT is required.

LANGAUGE REQUIREMENTS

The language proficiency requirement is satisfied by;

- A minimum score of 61 (speaking 26 and listening 22) on TOEFL/IBT or a level 6 on the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) Exam

FINANCIAL AID

DULA is proud to offer financial assistance to students who need funding for their education, only if they meet certain federally designated guidelines.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Be a U.S. Citizen or Permanent Resident
- A male student between the ages of 18-25 must be registered with the Selective Service. Older students must have been registered during this age period.
- Females and students born before 1960 are exempt from this requirement.
- The student must maintain SAP (satisfactory academic progress) as defined by school policy while in attendance.
- The student must complete verification if required, prior to funds being disbursed.
- Not owe any refunds on a Pell Grant or other awards received and not be in default on repayment on any type of student loan.

LOAN AMOUNTS

The maximum annual loan amount for independent undergraduate students is US \$12,500. Of this amount, US \$5,500 is a direct subsidized loan and US \$7,000 is unsubsidized. The maximum annual loan amount for graduate students is US \$20,500. Of this amount, US \$8,500 is a direct subsidized loan and US \$12,000 is unsubsidized.
